AP Results

Fenwick is proud to have been recognized as an AP Gold Medal School for the past two years, and our most recent results continue that tradition of excellence. This summer's data revealed that our AP students achieved an outstanding overall passing rate of 91%!

Even more impressively, students earned a 100% passing rate in 7 of the 18 AP courses we offer: AP Literature, AP Language, AP European History, AP Physics, AP Precalculus, AP Spanish, and AP U.S. Government & Politics.

At Fenwick, every AP student is required to take the AP exam—unlike many schools that allow students to "opt out." This makes their achievements even more remarkable.

Congratulations to our students and teachers on this incredible accomplishment!



Fall Athletics

Fenwick's fields, courts, and courses are alive with energy as the fall athletic season kicks off! This year, we are proud to share that more than 320 students are participating in a fall sport—the highest level of involvement we've seen in recent years.
