We are excited to start the year and we are blessed to be together. We ask You to help us be open to the promise and possibility of our journey, a journey that we make with You.


Help us to find your presence and to sense your grace at work in our lives -- and in each other. May we be signs of your love to those around us -- especially those who struggle or suffer.

Service Hour Requirements

At Fenwick, we require many things for graduation—English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and more. We require service because we believe that some of the most valuable lessons come from giving to others. Through service, students develop compassion, leadership, and a deeper understanding of their role in the world.

Fenwick Service Requirements



WHY DO WE SERVE?

We believe that some of life's most important lessons are learned through serving others. Inspired by Jesus' example, we encourage students to engage in people-facing service—where they are interacting with other people and building genuine relationships.

WHAT 'COUNTS' AS SERVICE?

Service must be for a Non-Profit unless otherwise approved by Campus Ministry. Helping family or neighbors, while great, does not count towards the requirement. Seniors should aim for at least half of their service at the same location.

1/2 OF SERVICE DUE BY END OF SEMESTER 1

Failure to complete this will result in a 5 point deduction from a student's overall Theology grade (Ex: 92 + 87).

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

NHS is open to Juniors and Seniors who exceed the service requirement by 20 hours by the induction ceremony on May 7th. NHS Juniors must complete 40 total hours. NHS Seniors must complete 60 total hours.

At this weekend's McNiff Relays, the Fenwick Girls' Cross Country team captured their fourth consecutive victory, setting a new course record of 18:01 — breaking their own previous record by 38 seconds. Senior leaders Marianna Kay and Julia Davis, along with junior Adelaide Sweatman anchored the winning effort.

The Lady Crusaders also placed 4th with strong performances from junior Olivia Rowe, senior Caroline Blatchford, and freshman Kayla Antico, and earned 7th place thanks to senior Mireille Climenson, junior Amanda Moric, and freshman Katie Kelley.

In the boys' race, seniors Sam and Doron Appleyard teamed up with sophomore Chris Kay to finish 4th. The Fenwick Boys also claimed 7th place with the efforts of seniors John Reilly, Nondas Lagonakis, and Liam Sullivan, and came in 8th with the trio of juniors Will Rand and Ryan Gauthier, and sophomore Louis Della Gatta.

In the Coed Division, Sam Appleyard, Marianna Kay, and Adelaide Sweatman teamed up to take 1st place, while Doron Appleyard, Julia Davis, and Olivia Rowe earned the 2nd spot.
